A will, also called a last will and testament, can help you protect your family and your property. You can use a will to: let your property to individuals or organizations name a personal guardian to make sure your underage children name a trusted person to manage the property you leave to underage children and name a personal representative, the person who arranges for the terms of your will to be executed. What happens if I die without a will? In Alaska, if you die without a will, your property will be distributed in accordance with the state's intestacy laws. Alaska law gives your property to your closest relatives, starting with your husband and children. If you have neither a wife nor children, your grandchildren or your parents will take your property. This list continues with increasingly distant relatives, including brothers, grandparents, uncles and uncles, cousins, nieces, and nephews. If the court exhausts this list to find that you have no living relatives from blood or marriage, the state will take your property. Do I need a lawyer to make a will in Alaska? Not. You can make your own will in Alaska by using do-it-yourself Nolo software or online programs. However, you may want to consult a lawyer in some cases. For example, if you think your will may be challenged or if you want to disinherit your spouse, you should talk to a lawyer. The products that do Nolo's will tell you when it's wise to seek the advice of a lawyer. What are the requirements for signing a will in Alaska? To finalize your will in Alaska, you must sign your will in front of two witnesses, and your witnesses must sign your will within a reasonable period of time after you have witnessed your signature or identification. Alaska Stat. § 13.12.502. Do I need to have my will symbolized? No, in Alaska, you don't have to symbolize your will to make it legal. However, Alaska allows you to do your will self-proof and you need to go to a notary if you want to do that. A self-proof will speed up ratification, because the court can accept the will without contacting the witnesses who signed it. To make your will self-proof, you and your witnesses will go to the notary and sign an affidavit proving you are and that each of you knew that he was signing the will. Do I have to use my will to name a personal representative? Yes. In Alaska, you can use your will to name a personal representative who will ensure that the provisions in your will are made after your death. Nolo will software and online will produce a letter to your personal representative that generally explains what the job requires. If you do not name a personal representative, the validation court will appoint someone to take on the task of clearing your property. I can revoke or change change Will? In Alaska, you can revoke or change your will at any time. You may revoke your will by: Performing a reseal, such as burning, tearing, canceling, eliminating or destroying all or part of the will for the purpose of revoking it. You can perform this recall yourself or ask someone else to do it for you. By making a new will that revokes part or all of the will stating this in the new will or in contradictory terms in the new will. Alaska Stat. § 13.12.507. If you and your spouse divorce or your marriage is annulled, any gift in your will or the appointment of your spouse as personal representative or administrator is automatically revoked unless your will expressly states otherwise. Alaska Stat. § 13.12.804. If you need to make changes to your will, it's best to revoke it and make a new one. However, if you only have very simple changes to make, you could add an amendment to your existing will - this is called codicil. In any case, you will need to finalize your changes with the same formalities you used to make your original will (see above). Where can I find the laws of Alaska to make wills?
